What Is Good Teamwork?

Good teamwork happens when a group works together effectively towards a shared goal — listening to each other, dividing tasks fairly, and supporting one another throughout the process.

Key Traits of Good Teamwork



Communication

Team members share ideas clearly and listen actively.



Trust

Everyone relies on each other to deliver their part.



Shared Goals

The team stays focused on a common objective.



Respect

All contributions are valued, regardless of role.

Good Teamwork in Action

When teamwork works well, you can see it in the results:



- **Tasks are divided fairly**
- **Everyone contributes meaningfully**
- **Problems are solved together**
- **The outcome is stronger than any individual effort**



What Is Bad Teamwork?

Bad teamwork occurs when a group fails to collaborate effectively. Poor communication, unequal effort, and lack of respect can quickly derail even the best-intentioned projects.

Signs of Bad Teamwork



Poor Communication

Team members don't share information or fail to listen to each other.



Unequal Workload

Some members do all the work while others contribute little or nothing.



Lack of Respect

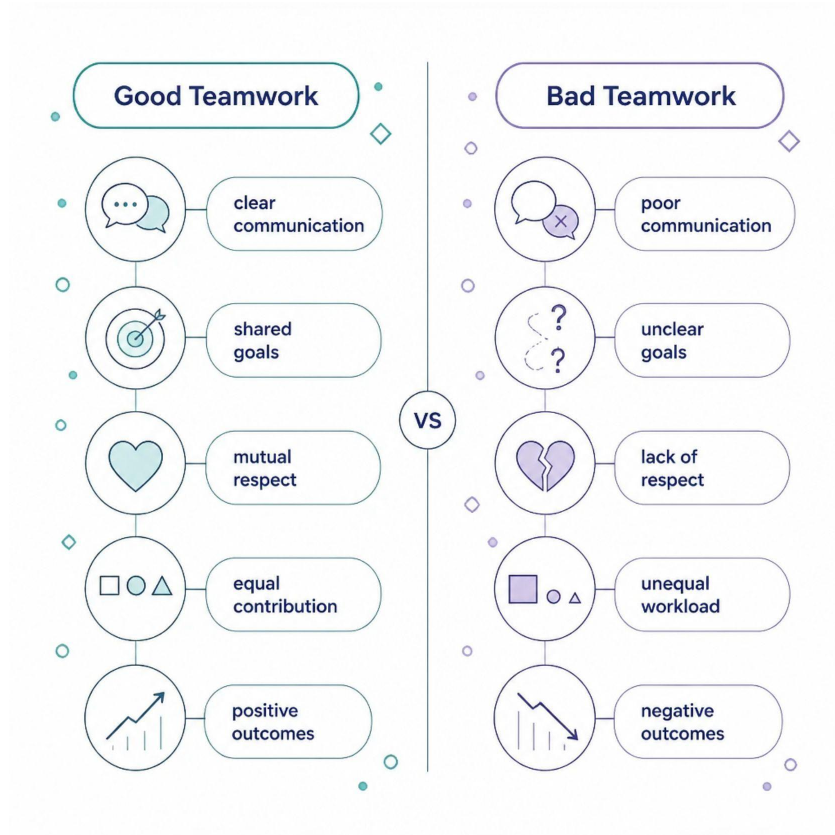
Ideas are dismissed, and team members feel undervalued or ignored.



No Clear Goal

Without a shared direction, efforts become scattered and unfocused.

Good vs Bad Teamwork



Understanding the difference between good and bad teamwork helps us reflect on our own behaviour in group settings — and make better choices as team members.
